



We use wh- questions to ask for specific information. Wh- questions begin with a question word.

We use what to ask about a thing.

What is your name?

It's Steve.

We use **when** to ask about a time or date.

When is your birthday?

It's in April.

We use where to ask about a place.

Where are they from?

They are from Portugal.

We use **which** to ask about a thing from a small number of choices.

Which girl is his sister?

**She is** the one with the brown hair.

We use who to ask about people.

Who is your favourite actress?

It's Salma Hayek.

We use **whose** to ask who something belongs to.

Whose are these shoes?

They're Tom's.

We use **why** to ask about a reason.

Why are you sad?

I'm sad because my dog is lost.

Be careful, don't confuse **whose** with **who's** (**who is**); they sound very similar!

We use **how old** and the verb **be** to ask about someone's age.

How old is she?

She's 14 years old.

NOT How many years has she? She has 14 years.
